

## **Request for Information (“RFI”) - Statewide Inbound Mail Processing Equipment**

May 15, 2020

### **INTRODUCTION**

The S.C. State Election Commission (“SEC”) is seeking information and estimated costs for a uniformed inbound mail processing equipment system, to help facilitate timely and accurate reporting.

### **GENERAL INFORMATION**

The state of South Carolina, utilizing the ES&S ExpressVote voting system statewide, serves nearly 3.4 million registered voters within 46 counties and 2200+ precincts. All voters are required to sign the outer envelope of inbound ballots; that signature is used to verify the voter’s identity before opening and processing. Counties currently utilize various methods and equipment in the sorting and verifying of mail; however, as a result of COVID-19, a more uniformed system and method is needed due to an anticipated significant increase in absentee ballots. We expect the process to exceed 500,000 absentee voters for the 2020 General Election. ### **PROJECT DESCRIPTION**

The purpose of this RFI is to generate information in order to potentially contract with a qualified vendor for necessary equipment that can: process incoming ballot envelopes and other election related mail; sort envelopes to varying categories; capture images of envelopes; read and interpret information on the envelope face; interface with the statewide Voter Registration Election Management System (“VREMS”) to track and produce election specific voter registration; imprint information on the envelope; verify expected contents; and open the envelope. The implementation deadline would be no later than October 1, 2020. Vendors should respond with their best proposed solution along with possibilities for potential enhancements.

## **SCOPE OF WORK**

The new solution must meet all listed minimum requirements as well as offer enhanced services to help efficiently process incoming ballot envelopes and other election related mail.

### **Minimum System Requirements:**

- 1) System must have the ability to upload information into the voter registration system (VREMS) including, but not limited to, return date, batch number, voter ID, and election ID.
- 2) Vendor shall propose an automated envelope sorting system that is scalable with “sorting pockets” or equivalent function or feature.
- 3) System must have the ability to sort out—into variable “pockets”—ballot envelopes that have been marked as challenged or rejected.
- 4) System shall provide an accurate count of processed mail pieces.
- 5) System must scan and capture the image in the signature block area.
- 6) System must have the ability to identify and sort out automatically—into a different pocket—envelopes that have not been signed by the voter.
- 7) System must identify ballot return envelopes that may not contain all contents expected to be returned and sort such envelopes to a pocket. This ability must be customizable for each election as ballot size and envelope contents may change.
- 8) System must be able to open (mill) envelopes without damaging the contents. The milling area will have the ability to keep the area clean of all debris.
- 9) System shall store envelope images, voter data, and reports in a directory that can be accessible to the operator. All information shall be date/time stamped and archivable.
- 10) Vendor shall provide standard support as well as extended support during election periods (including weekend, holiday, and after-hours support).
- 11) Vendor shall provide training on new equipment, manuals and documentation, as well as ongoing support and maintenance services.
- 12) All system upgrades shall be performed on-site in consultation with SEC staff.

## **SUBMISSIONS:**

All submissions should include, at a minimum, all aforementioned requirements and are due by 5:00pm Eastern Standard Time on **Tuesday, May 26, 2020**. Please ensure your submission provides an itemized listing of equipment and pricing by county.
